# Caramel Dipped Apple

# INGREDIENTS:

- 12 oz. apple juice
- ¼ teaspoon cinnamon extract or ground cinnamon
- Whipped cream
- Caramel sundae topping

Heat the apple juice in a sauce pot on medium-high until simmering and add the cinnamon. Serve in a mug, topped with whipped cream and caramel.

### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 cup whole milk
- 2 tablespoons chocolate hazelnut spread
- 1 tablespoon caramel sundae topping
- 1 tablespoon unsweetened cocoa powder

In a small pot set over medium heat, add the milk, the chocolate hazelnut spread, sundae topping and cocoa. Whisk frequently until mixture is almost at a simmer. Serve hot.

# **INGREDIENTS:**

- 6 oz. brewed coffee
- 6 oz. hot milk (dairy or non-dairy)
- ½ teaspoon pumpkin pie spice

Mix all ingredients together in a mug.











# Chai Tea Latte

# **INGREDIENTS:**

- 6 oz. hot water
- 2 chai tea (or black tea) bags
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 6 oz. almond milk

Steep the teabags in the hot water for 5 minutes. In the

meantime, heat the almond milk and cinnamon stick in a small pot on the stove over medium heat until just below a simmer. Remove the tea bags from the water and combine with the milk and cinnamon stick.



# Winter White Hot Chocolate

# **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 cup half n half
- 1/4 cup white chocolate chips
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 jumbo marshmallow

Add half n half to a small pot over medium heat and stir in white chocolate. Stir constantly, until chocolate melts and mixture is just shy of a simmer. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla extract. Top with the marshmallow and serve.

# DR. MELISSA GRAY: SPREADING SEEDS OF HAPPINESS

# Dr. Melissa Gray was born and raised in a small town in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, called Buhl.

"I attended Tuscaloosa County High School and The University of Alabama. My first career was journalism and I worked for the *Tuscaloosa News* the majority of that time and then, decided to make a career change," said Gray.

When Dr. Gray had an issue at the newspaper, she went to a friend at the university for advice.

"I went to Dr. William Winternitz about possibly changing careers. I was in my mid-30's and he told me I was going to be in my 40's regardless and unhappy and I would either be in a career that I didn't enjoy anymore or I could be in my 40's and be a doctor. That was it. I went back and turned my notice in, said Gray.

Dr. Gray always wanted to go into the medical field, but she also had an early influence who encouraged her in the field of science.

"I had a teacher, Marilyn Stephens, who I am still friends with on Facebook. She pushed me in that direction as well, because she knew I loved science. She took time with me, but it didn't seem like the right time at that time and it wasn't. Things happen for a reason, so it was good that I went through journalism for that many years, because that helped me be more comfortable with people. Those 15 years in journalism helped me with the relationships I have with patients today," said Gray.

# Dr. Gray always wanted to be in family medicine.

"It's the relationships. It's taking care of people that I felt were being overlooked and dismissed. I'm always for that person. Older people are my favorite. I feel like a lot of doctors go in, hit the high points, and write prescriptions. That's what I was seeing and hearing about from others. I see my grandparents in the older patients. I take care of them like I would take care of my own. If they are not my family, they're somebody's family," said Gray.

Working at the Waddell Center for 11 years gave her experience, but also allowed her to see how she wanted to serve in her own practice.

"I wanted to do things differently, so I opened Better Weighs. We have a program, which is paid for by insurance, called chronic care. We are able to do so much with these patients. I have so many instances of their lives

being completely changed because somebody is listening, somebody's paying attention and they know that we care. It's night and day. Once they saw that we cared, their lives have completely turned around," said Gray.

A big influence on Dr. Gray's life was her maternal grandfather, John McAteer, who raised horses.

"If I wasn't at school, I spent pretty much every waking hour with my grandfather. He raised horses and that was everything to me. I would stay with them until my mother made me come inside. It was just riding, that was part of it, but just training," said Gray.

Word of mouth from those who have been treated by Dr. Gray has been the best advertisement for her practice.

"I listen. I take time with patients. It's what I'm called to do, to hear them, to take care of them, and lift them up. That's how we take care of our patients," said Gray.

# Dr. Gray has two daughters.

"My daughter, Lauren Harwell, is my manager at the urgent care. My other daughter is Amanda Steeley. My daughters are 14 months apart. Amanda lived in the Athens area until she got married," said Gray.

When thinking about her roots in Tuscaloosa

> County, Dr. Gray sees similarities between there and Athens.


"Northport always felt like home and it didn't take long for Athens to feel the same way and my kids say the same thing. I can't say I would never move, but I don't see it. This is my new home. I would never move away the way I feel today," said Gray.

Between Better Weighs, Urgent Care, and beautymarx Dr. Gray stays on the go.

"beautymarx was the first business I started after leaving the Waddell Center. We do IV's, massages, and facials. It helps people feel better," said Gray.

While Dr. Gray has the ability to write prescriptions for issues such as depression, she has some advice.

"The best advice I have to fill you up is to do for somebody else. In so doing, that will change your life. When you get the focus off of yourself. Be good to others and do for others. That's happiness all day long," said Gray. Our purpose is not to live in a bubble and amass things. Making someone smile, that's rewarding. You smiling may be the only smile someone gets that day. I learned that from Dr. Lee Carter. You've got to help make people happy, make them smile."



cup of joe from the coffee shop drive-thru. Never leave your dog in the car unattended, especially when the temperatures are frigid.

**DOGGIE PLAYDATES.** Invite a friend and their dog over for a play date. Your dog will enjoy playing with their friend while you enjoy chatting with yours. Be sure to slowly introduce the dogs before turning them loose to play.

WALK ON A TREADMILL. Some dogs have more energy than others and require several long walks during the day. You can invest in a treadmill to give your dog the exercise he or she needs.

**INTERACTIVE STIMULATION GAMES.** There are several games you can play with your dog to offer them the needed stimulation to keep them from becoming bored.

Hide and Seek: This game should be played with two or more people. Person One should wait with the dog while Person Two hides. Person Two can call for the pup. After the dog finds Person Two, reward the dog with a small treat and play again. This time Person One can hide.

Tug of War: Using a long rope or toy, have your pup hold one end in his mouth while you hold the other end in your hand. Move it around, tug, and pull. Allow your dog to try and pry the rope from your hand.

Three-Cup Game: With your dog watching, place a treat under one of three cups. Mix the cups up then have your pup try to uncover the treat.

Treasure Hunt: Hide several treats or favorite toys around your house. See how many your dog can sniff out.

Fetch up and down the stairs: Playing fetch

with your dog up and down the stairs is a

great way to run your dog's energy out and get them some needed winter exercise. Throw your dog's favorite toy down the stairs. Allow them to retrieve it and call them back up to do it again. Some dogs will even enjoy chasing a laser pointer up and down the stairs.


Obstacle course: Set up an obstacle course for your dog to complete. Use tunnels to run through, pillows to jump over, and chairs to weave between.

PUZZLE TOYS. Local pet stores sell a plethora of puzzle toys that will provide your dog with lots of stimulation while trying to get to their favorite treat. There are many different kinds of puzzle toys. Try to rotate through various ones so your pup doesn't fully master the toy right away.

PURCHASE OR MAKE A SNUFFLE MAT. Like puzzle toys, these mats make it challenging and entertaining for your dog to find their treats. You can also use it to hide their food, promoting slower eating.

**CUDDLE UP AND TAKE A NAP.** There is nothing wrong with snuggling up on the couch under a blanket and binge-watching your favorite Netflix show with your favorite furry friend snoozing by your side.

ast Athens Living Magazine was able to sit down with Christina Bowsher and discuss the importance of the Limestone Child Advocacy Center in the community.

"We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit and we provide services to children who have been victimized by abuse. Law enforcement or Alabama Department of Human Resources will refer a child and their non-offending family members to our center and we conduct a forensic interview. The forensic interview is an unbiased interview where the child has the opportunity to tell their story one time. It is recorded and can be watched by anyone who needs to see the interview such as law enforcement, medical professionals, the district attorney's office, and DHR. From that point, they can figure out what the next steps are to help the child," said Bowsher.

To accomplish the work of Limestone Child Advocacy Center, it takes a team of several members.

"The director is Becky Bentley. She makes this whole place run. Without her, we don't have any money, so she does all the grant writing. Ann Chandler is a forensic interviewer. Stephanie Abner is the victim advocate. I do community awareness, fundraising, and marketing. Teresa Browning is the bookkeeper. Jennifer Kassay is our education specialist. She is in the Limestone County Schools and teaches a safety curriculum for grades K through 8th. We have Sydney who is our therapy intern and Pam Burkett and Colby White who are our therapists," said Bowsher.

As we are in the middle of the holiday season, the Limestone Child Advocacy Center is also a resource for gifts for local young people in need and their families.

"Especially around the holidays, we've had different groups of people come together and sponsor a family. They provide toys or clothes and that has been really helpful to these families. We don't release any information about who the families are, but we give lists and accept the donations for the families." said Bowsher.

Bowsher gets to experience first-hand what it means to these families to have gifts.

"When they come in and pick up the wrapped presents, their faces and their eyes are so big and they are so thankful. It's really great to see how much they appreciate everything. They walk through the door and see all the things they can pick out. It's really wonderful to see," said Bowsher.

The Limestone Child Advocacy Center needs support not just through the holidays, but year-round.

"Outside of the holidays, spreading the word about the work we do here is really important. We need people in the community to know that we are an available resource to children and their families. Everything we do here is through grants and fundraising. All of our services are 100% free of charge. We never charge any of the families who come to us for services," said Bowsher.

The Limestone Child Advocacy Center has several ways to connect.

"Our website is limestonecac.com. We are on Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok. We are trying to make a presence there. Our phone number is 256-998-5556 and our physical address is 104 East Washington Street Athens 35611," said Bowsher.

For Bowsher, her work at the Limestone Child Advocacy Center is a passion.

"For me, with the community awareness, being able to help these families when they are in a time of crisis, whether it's talking to a family member or sitting with one of the kids or going into the school and hanging out with one of them. It's about being there for them during a time of crisis and helping them as much as possible," said Bowsher.




# COLOR-BY-NUMBERS **LOGIC PUZZLE**
