n Harvest, on a quaint countryside, there is a special needs farm called Next Step Farms. This extraordinary sanctuary was created so individuals with special needs could find solace, friendship, and a sense of belonging.

The farm was founded by Robin Kramer, a compassionate soul with a heart of gold. This effort was inspired by her own experiences working as a special needs teacher. Robin dreamed of creating a space where people of all abilities could thrive and reach their full potential.

"I am a retired special education teacher from Madison County Schools. I spent all 25 years working with the special needs population. Even in my college career, I knew that special needs individuals after age 21 had limited opportunities after their school career ended. After 10 years of teaching, it went from a head matter to a heart matter," said Kramer.

At Next Step Farms, every individual is welcomed with open arms and celebrated for their uniqueness. The farm offered a wide range of activities tailored to meet the specific needs of each person. There are opportunities inside to learn life skills and outside to connect with nature and learn outdoor responsibilities.

"We teach functioning daily living skills. We started teaching them how to apply those skills. In the kitchen, they learn how to make food items like jams, jellies, and pickles. Outside, they learn area by building a chicken coop. They learn the life cycle of a chicken by the chicken being in the room. We hatch eggs. We watch chickens lay eggs. We watch the circle of life," said Kramer.

One of the most heartwarming aspects of Next Step Farms is the sense of community it fosters. The individuals formed strong bonds with one another and support each other through their challenges. They celebrated each other's successes, big and small, and learned from each other's experiences. This gives the clients at Next Step Farms purpose.

"My clients want purpose. If we're honest with ourselves, that's what all of us want. We all want to be valued and we all want to feel we have a purpose," said Kramer.

The farm organizes regular events for families and the wider community. These events provided a platform for raising awareness about special needs and showcase the incredible talents and abilities of the individuals at Next Step Farms. fter winning the PGA Tour event at the 3M Open in July 2023, Lee Hodges became a household name in the golf world. Still a local guy, Lee was born in Huntsville and was raised in Ardmore.

"It was great. I loved the small town and the small town feel. I loved everybody kind of knowing everybody. A lot of people know who my dad is around here which is great. I get all my athletic ability from my mom. Nobody really knows that, but seriously, I really loved growing up around here," said Lee.

With his parents living at Southern Gayles, Lee began playing golf at an early age.

"I always played with my dad and kind of tinkered around, but I probably started really playing when I was 12 I would say. That's when I got serious and began focusing on getting better," said Lee.

Early on, Lee was a smaller kid and that led him to the decision to play golf.

"I loved baseball and all my friends played baseball. I didn't know I was going to be a great golfer. My dad took me to the Ardmore High School field one day to hit balls. I think he knew that I shouldn't play baseball. Baseball and golf were played in the same season and I was starting to pick. I couldn't even hit the ball out of the infield because I was so small and decided to play golf and it worked out," said Lee.

When it came to learning the game of golf, Lee had some guidance from some older friends early on.

"I had played at Canebrake, so I had a lot of buddies who played out there. They were older than me, it seems all my friends are older than me. Craig Whitt and Stewart Whitt, they both played at Athens and are really good players who helped me. Stew played for Alabama. Of course, I learned from my dad and started working with Steven Purrier who I still work with today," said Lee.

Lee began dating his future wife, Savannah, when they were both sophomores in high school, Lee at Ardmore and Savannah at Elkmont.

"We met at a basketball game. I was playing basketball for Ardmore and she was cheerleading for Elkmont. One of the guys on my team was a cousin to Savannah and that's how we met," said Lee.

As the spouse of a golfer, Savannah shared her thoughts on the golfing lifestyle.

"It's interesting. It took me a while to get used to it, because our experiences are different from our friends' experiences. I just really got plugged in with the wives of other golfers. I got involved with the PGA Wives Association and accepted this as our new normal. I'm very thankful that we get to do it together," said Savannah.

One of Savannah's favorite parts of being on the Tour is giving back.

"We get to see some really cool places and experience some things that we wouldn't otherwise. Through the PGA Wives Foundation, we get to help charities throughout the country. It gives us such a broad spectrum of who we get to touch. We partner with a lot of children's charity programs. First Tee programs reach out to underprivileged children and gives them a chance to experience golf. We also partner with organizations who help children with special needs," said Savannah.

The Hodges' also donate to the Stacy Wolfe Breast Cancer Foundation.

In addition to small town life, Lee and Savannah have experienced big city life.

"We lived in Birmingham for two years. We realized quickly that just wasn't for us. We are small town people. We like to come home and be able to get a coffee in five minutes or walk our dog around the neighborhood. It's home and that's the kind of people we are," said Lee.

"It feels good to be around people who are similar to us. We are

15-20 minutes from both of our parents. We get to see our nieces and nephews grow up while we're home. Everybody knows everyone. I'll have people stop me in the grocery store and ask me about Lee's golf. Even if they don't know us personally, they feel close to us because we are local,"

Since the big PGA win in July, Lee said life hasn't changed that much at home.

said Savannah.

"It's changed less at home than everywhere else. I'm still the same guy that people have known all my life. It's definitely different on the road with more people asking for my time. I don't mind. I'll sign autographs until my hand falls off because I know one day people won't want them. I have a lot more fans. It's cool to have people root for you," said Lee.

For the first time in his career, Lee will get to play in the country's most prestigious golf tournament this month as a result of his 3M Open win last July. Hodges will tee off at

> the Masters Tournament, April 11-14 in Augusta, Georgia for a chance to win the coveted Green Jacket.




